Schedule: Domain registration

1. Applicability

1. This schedule applies to our domain registration services.

2. Registration

- 2.1. When we register a domain on your behalf, we act as your agent, so you are asking us to register the domain in your own name.
- 2.2. Different domain names have different fees and, by asking us to register a domain for you, you are agreeing to pay the fees associated with the domain in question.
- 2.3. If we cannot register the domain for you, we will tell you.
- 2.4. Once we have registered the domain for you, you cannot amend it. It is your responsibility to ensure that you tell us the domain and other details correctly when you order it.

3. Charging and renewal

- 3.1. We charge for domains on an ongoing basis.
- 3.2. We will automatically attempt to renew the domain registration with the relevant registry for you.
- 3.3. On, or shortly after, the domain registration's renewal, you must check that renewal has completed correctly, and you must notify us if it has not.

4. Registry terms

- 4.1. You must accept and comply with the terms of the domain name registrar applicable for the purchased domain name.
- 4.2. We draw your attention to ICANN's "[Registrant Rights and Responsibilities](#)" document.

5. DNSSEC

- 5.1. Nominet has specific terms for DNSSEC. If you choose to enable DNSSEC for a domain name for which Nominet is the registry, you agree to the following:
 - 5.1.1. The way in which DNSSEC works and the affect that its use can have on the stability of domain name records;
 - 5.1.2. That Nominet accepts no liability in relation to the operation or use of DNSSEC records and that registrants accept all risk in relation to the use of DNSSEC in relation to their domain names; and
 - 5.1.3. That Nominet will take reasonable steps to correct any error in the DNSSEC records, where such an error is as a result of a mistake on Nominet's part, but will otherwise accept no liability for the error
 - 5.1.4. To the extent that you register domain names for yourself, you also confirm that you understand and accept the risks of using DNSSEC and that Nominet

accepts no liability in relation to
the operation or use of DNSSEC

- 5.2. If you register domain names on behalf of someone else, you indemnify us and Nominet in relation to all liabilities, costs, expenses, damages and losses (including any direct or indirect consequential losses, loss of profit, loss of reputation and all interest, penalties and legal and other professional costs and expenses) suffered or incurred by us or Nominet as a result of your failure to notify your customers of the above information.
